




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School Background

The school was constructed during the school year 1983 – 1984 through the resolution passed by the Barangay Council spearheaded by the Brgy. Captain Simeon Hernandez supported by the late Mayor Jose Oliveros. It started serving the community of Barangay Mambugan during the School Year 1986-1987 with 4 teachers handling 5 classes with an enrollment of 142. This was located at Agnesville Subd. Mambugan Antipolo City with an area of 2,590 sq.m. Since then, the school catered the minds of young Mambuguenos and continued to exert efforts to soar high not just in academic but in the non-academic aspects as well.

Spearheaded by the principal, Mrs. Wilma R. Doctor, the whole school and the community stakeholders worked as full partners and supported the endeavor of *Wash In School Program* which contributed significantly to the schools Maturing Level in the School-Based Management.








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Deworming Indicators Semi-annual **Pupils Deworming Dewormed**

The school continues to encourage parents to allow pupils to undergo deworming.



- Inadequate number of toilet seats and handwashing facilities for the total number of school population
- Support of stakeholders/parents
- Overload teachers' schedules
- Students'/pupils' attitudes on compliance
- Shortage of financial means
- Shifting of Classes

- ✓ Continued partnership with NGOs (Save the Children)
- ✓ Supportive Teachers and Non-Teaching Personnel
- ✓ Inclusion of WINS Program in the In-Service Training of Teachers
- ✓ SBM Documentation which highlights WINS program
- ✓ Integration of WinS in the preparation of DLL and Lesson Plans

Enabling Factors for School Improvement

- Creation of TWG Team per grade level
- Inclusion of WinS in the ESIP/ AIP
- Integration of WinS Education in the lesson plans
- Focused Group Discussion on the improvement of WinS implementation
- Monitoring, evaluation and documentation of the activities being conducted like daily group handwashing and toothbrushing and keeping updated records of the activities

- Availability of Information Education and Communication (IEC) materials posted on handwashing area and comfort rooms
- Orientation of parents, stakeholders,
 LGUs on school health programs
- Availability of sanitary napkins
- Presence of MRF (Material Recovery Facility) on proper waste segregation
- Checklist on monitoring and evaluation
- Availability of personal hygiene kit for each pupil/student

Problems <u>Encountered</u> Inadequate handwashing facilities and comfort rooms Parents' perception about deworming.

Objective: Promoting awareness on the part of School Health and Nutrition Section particularly on proper hygiene and sanitation and to increase the number of pupils availed different health services like deworming, handwashing, toothbrushing and dental screening and treatment

Proponent : WinS TWG

Accomplishment Repo

To increase the number of pupils dewormed from 22.22 $\frac{\text{M}}{\text{M}}$ or 891 pupils to 85% in three years.

To increase the number of pupils performed handwashing and toothbrushing drill

To increase the number of pupils availed dental screening and treatment from 9.99 %_or 400 pupils to 85% in three years.









