In 1990 the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) established the Joint Monitoring Programme for Water Supply, Sanitation and Hygiene (JMP). Since then, the JMP has been instrumental in establishing global norms to benchmark and compare progress in water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) across countries.
