Key Characteristics of CHT

- CHT Represents 10% of total area & 1% of total population (1.6 millions) of BD
- Approx. 50% tribal population, more than 13 different ethnic communities
- Most of the CHT population are engaged in subsistence agriculture.
- Topography: remoteness, inaccessibility, fragility. Most of the people live in scattered habitats known as 'Para'.
- Low human resource development- vocational & social skills
- Have different traditional & administrative setup with complex coordination mechanisms
- Post Conflict Area, Peace Accord was signed in 1997. Separate Ministry of CHT formed

Challenges in CHT

- Poor physical & socio-economic infrastructure
- Limited non-farm employment opportunities
- Low livelihood diversification
- Lower income & non-income poverty
- Livelihoods: More susceptible & vulnerable
- Low carrying capacity
- Access and ensuring quality basic social services facing challenges due to remoteness, difficult terrain, inaccessibility, and fragility



Para Center, hub of all basic services to the community



Para Center – Hub of Basic Services

Small house of 300-400 Sq. feet area, a venue for

- Early learning and pre-primary education
- Health and nutrition services for women (pregnant & lactating), children (6-23 months, U-5 children) and adolescent girls
- EPI outreach site & center for all other basic services
- Site for demonstration of sanitary latrines, safe water use, hand washing and other appropriate WASH technologies
- Statistical information Centre and meeting place for the community
- Run by a Para Worker from the same community and is managed by a PCMC

Para Centre Service : WASH

- Demonstration point of safe water facilities, hand washing System and improved latrine.
- Awareness Building Center about WASH (Hygiene Promotion)
- Gender and disability responsive WASH facility installation and renovation in catchment area.





Para Centre Sustainability

- The GoB and UNICEF are moving towards sustainable Para Centers.
 UNICEF is engaged to enhance the capacity of para workers, health workers and NGO workers
- The strategy for advocacy through Para Centers utilizes the ECD package.
- GoB has allocated fund from revenue budget for smooth operation
- At the national level, the 7th Five Year Plan, NCP and ECD Policy reflect the commitment to make investment for the development and growth of children in their early years
