



Three Star Approach


- Monitors National Standards, which are based on global SDG targets and indicators
- Measures adherence to basic Service level and expanded service level using SDG core questions + national relevant SDG expanded questions
- Used for national monitoring and global reporting on SDG progress
- Comparison between countries possible and intended

- Determine national priorities to define star levels and benchmarking
- Integrate SDG basic service level into benchmarking and use SDG core questions + other nationally relevant WinS-related questions
- Uses transparency to increase accountability
- Used as management tool for incentivizing implementation quality to reach at least basic service level
- Comparison between subnational levels possible and intended, creates healthy competition
- Comparison between countries not possible or intended
- Direct feed back serves as orientation and motivation

Why the Three Star Approach

- Helps schools meet the essential criteria for a healthy and protective learning environment for children.
- It aims to address the bottlenecks to effectiveness and expansion of WASH in Schools programmes.
- Encourages healthy habits and integrated into daily school routines for children
- Engages the communities and teachers

Global adaptation of the Approach

In 2018:

41 countries used the Three Star Approach: reaching 587,000 schools: (in Philippines > 36,000 schools, in India 550 000, China 111 counties, in Bangladesh to be rolled out in 50 schools, in Cambodia in 9000 schools)
